


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Original instructions posted in the Creative Memories Blog on 10/25/2023


- Step 1: Select a paper for your base, one for your top base, cardstock for matting your top base, and a variety of coordinating scraps and/or papers.
- Step 2: Cut your cardstock color (middle layer) to 11-1/2" x 11-1/2". I trimmed and matted my photos from the center first to save paper. Cut your top layer to 11-1/4" x 11-1/4". Adhere those two layers onto your base.
- Step 3: To create your wreath, use the inside of your Jumbo Circle pattern and red blade to create a circle. Mark the center of your circle. Then cut several strips of paper at 5-1/2" x 1", creating a banner notch in the top. See my blog post for a technique.
- Step 4: Layer your pieces onto the circle, mixing up the patterns. I used about 18 pieces. Use Repositonal tape runner to adhere.



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- Step 5: Before adhering the wreath to your base, use your Custom
 Cutting System and larger circle of your trio circles, use the
 red blade in the center track to cut a circle out of your top
 layer of your layout base. Do it where the wreath will cover
 the hole. Use that circle to adhere to the center of your
 wreath, then adhere the whole wreath over the hole you cut.
- Step 6: If you haven't already, trim and mat your photos. 2 photos are 3"x 3", and the other is 5-3/4" x 3-3/4". Adhere as shown.
- Step 7: Embellish and journal.
